A message from the President

I'd like to say how grateful I am for this opportunity to serve as the Chapter President this year. Arkansas AFS has been such a welcoming environment for fisheries and aquatic resource professionals across the state. The Society is one of the major reasons I've been able to connect with others to further the stewardship of our natural resources. I'd like to continue to foster the work of predecessors in improving connectivity among members.

Our 2023 Chapter Meeting was a great success! Thank you to all of the speakers, attendees, the Executive Committee (EXCOM), workshop leaders, and others who helped with organizing the Annual Meeting in Conway this March. We had 132 registrants, 43 speakers, and 14 poster presentations Because of the outstanding participation, we had to reduce speaker slots



from 20 to 15 minutes and add a Friday morning session! We also awarded our first-ever **Natural State Fisheries Scholarship** to graduate student Derek Owens and undergraduate student Ben Johnson, as well as the first "Subunit of the Year" Award, which went to Arkansas Tech. It's encouraging to see such high quality work being conducted across the Natural State and I hope to continue to see our Chapter grow.

We're looking forward to a productive and opportunity-filled year for our members. Our chapter EXCOM worked alongside AGFC Aquatic Nuisance Species Program Coordinator to host an Invasive Aquatic Plan ID workshop taught by Dr. Turnage, Mississippi State University and Benjamin Sperry, University of Florida. We are also in the early stages of developing a series of "Data Analysis through R" workshops, a useful skillset in our increasingly data-dominated profession. Any other members who have ideas for professional workshops are always encouraged to submit those to the EXCOM. I'd like to introduce Jacob Martin, AGFC Fisheries Biologist, as our new "Activities Coordinator" who will help coordinate these workshops and seek out opportunities for events that the Chapter can support. Additionally, we will soon be in need of an Environmental Affairs Committee Chair to keep an eye on upcoming legislation that may affect our ability to promote the wise management, conservation, and use of the fishery and aquatic resources of Arkansas.

NEW LOGO, SAME FISH



Earlier this year, chapter members voted on a new chapter logo design. The new design would better coordinate with the national AFS logo, which was redesigned in 2021. However, the focal point of the Arkansas Chapter logo, the "Arkansas Eco-Region Fish" still remains. But where did that design originate?

The "eco-region fish" was an original design by Ed Kluender, who submitted it for consideration as the logo for the 143rd Annual Meeting of the American Fisheries Society, hosted by the AR Chapter in 2013. The fish represents each of the 4 ecoregions in the state, with the dorsal area and fins for the Ozark Mountains; the ventral area markings and fins for the Ouachita Mountains and Gulf Coastal Plain, the lateral line represented the Arkansas River Valley , to the Southeastern peduncle representing the Arkansas Delta.



Additional highlights include a student-professional roundtable lunch, a keynote address by Dr. Ginny Adams from the University of Central Arkansas, and we awarded the first ever recipients of the Natural State Fisheries Scholarships. The recipients include Derek Owens and Ben Johnson. Congratulations to them and to all award recipients!

Business Meeting Minutes | March 17, 2023

The Chapter President, Christy Graham, welcomed everyone to the business meeting, introduced officers, acknowledged past presidents in attendance, and introduced the AFS Southern Division (SD AFS) Past-President Jason Olive.

Determination of Quorum – Quorum was met with 58 members in attendance.

- Review and Approval of 2022 Annual Business Meeting Minutes Prior to this meeting, the 2022 Arkansas AFS annual business meeting minutes were placed online for members to read.; Jeff Quinn motioned to approve the minutes and Jimmy Barnett seconded the motion.
- SDAFS Report Jason Olive provided a report from SDAFS. He talked about the impact that COVID-19 pandemic had on membership and encouraged everyone to become a member of the parent society of AFS. Jason also shared a message from new SDAFS President, who encouraged involvement in AFS technical committees and encouraged members to nominate peers for awards. Jason echoed the need for participation in technical committees.
- President's Report Christy Graham expressed that the Chapter meeting was a great success. Attendance and participation was excellent, with 92 professionals and 37 students in attendance. There were 43 oral presentations and 19 were from students. There were also 14 poster presentations. Christy thanked Dr. Ginny Adams for stepping in last minute to deliver the keynote address, thanked the moderators of the sessions, and thanked those who organized the workshops. The first workshop was Critical Thinking and Problem Solving taught by Dr. Vic DiCenzo and Sean Lusk. The second was a student workshop organized by Chelsea Gilliland and Will Lancett where students networked with professional mentors. Christy also provided highlights from the crayfish workshop hosted in May 2022. Lastly, Christy provided an update on the AR AFS investment fund, which earned enough dividends in 2022 to create the first two Natural State Fisheries Scholarships. Congratulations to Derek Owens and Ben Johnson, who were the recipients of those scholarships.
- Treasurer's Report Micah Tindall reported that the Conway Chamber of Commerce donated \$1,000 to the meeting. The remaining balance for the Chapter's account was \$16,405.21. Micah thanked Sean and Vic, who donated the registration fees from their workshop to the scholarship fund. Brian Wagner motioned to approve the treasurer report and Jacob Martin seconded the motion.
- Appointed Officer Reports: Newsletter (Jessica Feltz) asked for content for the newsletters. Jessica also announced it will be her last year to make the newsletter and encouraged anyone interested in the position to contact EXCOM. Dr. Kyler Hecke had been helping Jessica with social media posts and will continue that role. Webmaster (Dylan Hann) Hann asked that anyone wanting to add content to the website to please contact him.
- Activities and Raffle Committee Micah Tindall provided the report for Jordan Lindaman, Activities and Raffle Committee Chair. Jordan expressed gratitude for those who donated items for the raffle and silent auction, which raised \$1,573 and \$2,693, respectfully.

- Environmental Affairs Committee Brie Olsen provided the report from Dr. Sue Colvin, Environmental Affairs Committee Chair. In the previous year Arkansas AFS and the environmental chair committed ample efforts to two primary issues: Recovering America's Wildlife Act (RAWA) and the new Waters of the United States Rule (WOTUS rule). RAWA has bipartisan support in the senate and may come up for a vote as early as March. Fisheries and wildlife organizations will again be asked to engage in pushing the bill forward and our own membership will be highly influential in these efforts as Arkansas congressman Bruce Westerman chairs the Natural Resource Committee. A new funding mechanism for our state would be a tremendous benefit for state biodiversity and natural resources, and there is still strong optimism it will come up for a vote in this 118th US Congress. Arkansas AFS has actively engaged with membership and as well congressional leaders to support the bill. Also which dictates which U.S. waters have federal protection, was released by the EPA. This version gives greater wetland and headwater protection than the former rule. AFS has organized a group of members, of which Sue is included, who are working on a response paper to the new rule. Sue also provided input on AFS' response to the new rule which was presented by Drue Banta Winters on behalf of AFS to a House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee. The fact sheet lists Puppy Creek, a tributary in NW Arkansas and a part of one of our most important COA's, as an example of a protected tributary. Recognition of an Arkansas stream in WOTUS documentation is a strong signal that Arkansas waters are highly valued. Sue encouraged members to reach out to her to provide additional input on these or any other local or regional environmental concerns.
- Old Business Micah Tindall gave an overview of the scholarship process. Since the scholarship investment account has been created, the ad hoc committee has been dissolved. Micah thanked Sean Lusk for his leadership on that committee. Moving forward, the Treasurer, along with the President elected at the same meeting as the treasurer, will be the signees for the investment account. The scholarship committee will consist of the Chapter Secretary, Treasurer, and Chair of the Education Liaison Committee. The responsibilities of each committee member are listed in the updated Chapter bylaws. The scholarships are funded from growth of the investment account beyond the initial \$10,000 investment. The goal will be to award \$250 to an undergraduate student and \$500 to a graduate student annually. John Jackson suggested EXCOM consider a line item in the AR AFS budget so that scholarships are always available. JJ added that AFS EXCOM has authority to use up to \$2,000 for donations and sponsorships. If the investment account doesn't accumulate enough growth in any given year to fund the scholarships, EXCOM may elect to use part of that \$2,000 to fund the scholarship. The Scholarship applications will be released in the fall semester and checks will be awarded to recipients by the spring semester.
- Officer Election Results JJ Gladden reported that in the future, EXCOM will still have virtual voting via an online form, but voting will end the first day of the annual Chapter meeting. Seventy Chapter members voted this year; Sean Lusk was elected as treasurer and Dylan Hann was elected as president.

New Business

- * Brie updated members about changes to the procedural manual, which incorporated the new responsibilities for each officer regarding the scholarship committee.
- * JJ provided an update on the Hutton Program. There were 57 applicants this year from Arkansas! The Arkansas Game and Fish Commission will host four scholars throughout the state.
- * The Chapter has vacancies for various volunteer positions. Jordan Lindaman did a wonderful job as activities chair, but is vacating that volunteer position. Josh Melton agreed to take over silent auction and raffle. Since Dylan Hann was elected president, a new webmaster was also needed. Tyler Thomsen was nominated for that role. As discussed earlier in the meeting, the Chapter also needs a newsletter editor.
- * Ginny Adams updated the Chapter on the upcoming Southeastern Fishes Council meeting in 2024, which will be hosted in Arkansas.
- * Dr. Kyler Hecke suggested the Chapter change the AFS portion of the AR AFS logo to the updated AFS logo. Kyler also asked that the Chapter consider the Wildlife Society's annual Southeastern Wildlife Conclave when scheduling the Chapter meeting. Many students could not attend the Chapter meeting because of that conflict.
- * Tim Burnley motioned to adjourn the meeting and Chelsea Gilliland seconded the motion.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE REPORT

The Education Committee had a busy winter and spring preparing for the Arkansas AFS Chapter meeting in March! I hosted the second annual Student Professional Development Workshop during the Thursday afternoon lunch period. This was a two-phase panel discussion: phase one began with an open-floor panel discussion for all professionals and students, and moved into small-group discussions where individual panelists would rotate around to each round table. This allowed each student to have focused and personal conversations with each professional representing their respective conservation disciplines! We had a FANTASTIC turn-out and I was thrilled the ExCom chose to offer this event again! We approximated there were about 35 combined undergraduate, graduate, and post-graduate student attendees in addition to our rock-star panelists!

This year, we were able to host five diverse professionals, with myself as a moderator. panelists included Jessica Feltz (AGFC Conservation Social Science Lead), Dylan Hann (AGFC District 7 Fisheries Supervisor), Maxwell Hartman (AGFC Crayfish Conservation Ecologist), Tyler Savage (AGFC Jim Hinkle Spring River State Fish Hatchery Biologist), and Ben Huggins & Travis Thorne (AGFC Wildlife Enforcement Officers). A notable takeaway from the workshop last year was that some students were considering careers in wildlife enforcement, so we greatly appreciate Ben and Travis taking time of out of their busy schedules to speak with us!

When I had the opportunity to sneak into some conversations, I noticed students from all universities asking targeted questions about how to diversify or organize their CVs, how to stand out among the crowds, and how to get hired. My advice has been and will always be that having a personal connection with a student goes a long way (at least for me) so attending AFS workshops like this, volunteering with external agency or professional opportunities, and/or reaching out to a professional personally is one of the best ways to get yourself recognized. Step out of your comfort zone and friend groups, be bold, and have confidence about what you have to offer the future of fisheries and conservation!

For the students—looking towards the future in my role as the Education Liaison, I want to offer more than just a workshop at the chapter meeting, and spam your inboxes with job opportunities and conferences; I want to *HELP*, I want to *ENGAGE*, and I want to be someone you are comfortable coming to (I promise, I'm just a chicken-obsessed normal-ish person). I'd like to take another stab at meeting with your groups to discuss what the ExCom can do to maximize our time together. Following the spring ExCom meeting, I intend to reach out again so come prepared with creative ideas and maybe a fun-theme?
